- 4. Word of Life Bible Institute evaluated each student enrolled on the day campus was closed during the Spring 2020 Semester as a result of the COVID-19 Pandemic. The total number of eligible students at the time of evaluation was 396.
- 5. 396 students have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- 6. To be eligible for an Emergency Financial Aid Grant, a student must have been enrolled at the time campus was closed, have completed a 2019-2020 FAFSA, and meet the basic eligibility for Federal Financial Aid including being a US Citizen. The CARES Act does not allow for these funds to be disbursed to international or DACA students. Eligible students were able to apply for funds by completing the application at http://wol.to/studentcaresact until 8/20/2020. Awards were based on need related to expenses incurred and reported as a result of the closure of campus. Eligible application respondents were eligible for disbursements ranging from \$250 to \$2,822.32. Eligible students who did not respond to the application were eligible for an automatic disbursement of \$230.22. All disbursements were made by check payment to the student and mailed to the address indicated on the application or to their current home address in the case of students who did not respond to the application.
- 7. Instruction was emailed to all students' institutional email addresses informing them that the application was available. Additionally, an announcement was posted on Canvas, Word of Life Bible Institute's Learning Management System, and was visible to all enrolled students. Guidance about eligible expenses was provided on the application referenced above and is also provided here:
